- Their respective programs are critically reviewed by a jury panel consisting of Marcus Knutagård, Eoin O'Sullivan, Åsa Schelin, and Gustaf Henriksson.

The Future of Housing First

What does the future hold for Housing First? Join a discussion with representatives from European organizations, academia, and politics. 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM with a break from 2:30 PM – 3:00 PM.

- Saija Turunen, Head of Research at Finland's Y-Foundation, shares her latest research on Housing First work in various European countries.
- Director Freek Spinnewijn from FEANTSA (European Federation of National Organisations Working with the Homeless) talks about the organization's strategic development and goals.
- The day concludes with a discussion on the future of Housing First after 2026, where the audience can ask questions. The discussion is led by Marcus Knutagård, and among the panelists are Minister of Social Services Camilla Waltersson Grönvall and Freek Spinnewijn.
